Year 6



History

This term in History, children will look at the impact of WW2 on the local area, exploring in detail the Blitz, local evacuation and the role of local men and women during the war.



Year 6

Science

Over the term, we will explore the topics of 'Light' and 'Electricity' and by the end of the term, we will combine our scientific skills with those in DT to create light up Christmas Cards.

Geography

This term children will learn what globalisation is and how post WW2 advances have meant we are more connected than ever.

Religious Education

In RE we will focus on exploring the ways in which the concepts of justice, freedom, forgiveness, and reconciliation are taught through various faiths.

Design and Technology

In DT, we will be looking at designing playground structures and electrical systems using to make a WW2 inspired alarm/siren.

Art

In Art, we will look at the drawings of WW2 by the artist Henry Moore.

Music

In Music, we will be singing songs from the War eras.

Our focus will be upon the following line of enquiry: What decisions can people make with money?

Computing

Computing will focus on the key components of 'Sharing information' and 'Selection in Physical Computing'.



Year 6 Core Subjects

Writing

In Writing, children will begin by building on their LKS2 VGP knowledge in order to produce the following genres: Warning Story, Diary Entry, Persuasive Letter and an Explanation.

Maths

In Maths, we will be exploring Place Value to 10,000,000, Addition and Subtraction of large numbers, Multiplication and Division, Fractions and Geometry: Position and direction.

Reading

Children in Year 6 will participate in daily Guided Reading, focusing on the core text of *The Island at the End of Everything*. They will practice their fluency weekly in order to develop their stamina, expression and accuracy when reading longer extracts of text.



Maths

- Practise all times tables and related division facts.
- Explore place value of numbers to 10,000,000.
- Ask children to partition numbers.

Reading

- Encourage daily reading of at least 30 minutes on an age appropriate book.

Writing

- Allow children to revise key VGP concepts on BBC Bitesize, Grammarsaurus YouTube, or Oak National Academy.
- Encourage children to write in detail.

Wider curriculum

- Support research on WW2
- Allow children to go to the library to access records of WW2 impact on Hull
