Year 6	Hive		
In Y6 this week we have started our independent horror narrative. Firstly, we designed and sketched our monsters before generating a word bank to describe various features of the monster and how it would move.	This week in the Hive, we have been getting into the Christmas spirit. We have decorated our tree, made snowflakes, practiced our fine motor skills with dabbers, and began learning Christmas songs together!		
In Maths, we have looked at converting between kg and g and l and ml as well as looking how to find a percentage of an amount. We have been looking at previous reading extracts from SATs papers in preparation for our mock SATs next week - the children have worked in pairs to decipher which content domain the questions belong to and how to approach each question using previously generated success criteria.	In phonics this week some of the children have been practicing the letter 'c', with some of key words being crown, car, cat and cup!		
In Geography, we have continued our work on lines of longitude by looking at different time zones and working out the time difference between given places and the UK. We then started to look at different climate zones and biomes. And finally, on Thursday, we were lucky enough to work with the 'Prison, Me – No way!' workshop, which held discussions on important topics such as drugs, the dangers of electricity, the consequences of 'one punch' and life in prison. The children were very mature and took a great deal from the day!
