We are hopeful that by dedicating more time to this really important area, children will be able to utilise these skills in their learning and play.

Key Reminders

<u>Attendance</u>

Since returning to school from the summer holidays, our whole-school attendance has been disappointingly low. We have not yet met our target of 96% in any of the weeks we have been back and that is even before the winter illnesses kick in.

We want our children to make the most of all of the opportunities available to them at school but if they are not here, then they miss out on these. In addition, when they are absent for longer periods of time, they quickly fall behind in their learning and often find it hard to catch-up to where their peers are.

To put it into context, a child whose attendance is 90% at the end of the year, has missed around 95 hours of learning. If their attendance is no better than 90% during the whole of their primary schooling, then this equates to 665 hours of lost learning – this is learning that cannot be gained back.

Please help us by ensuring your child is at school on time, every day.

The children continue to amaze us with their enthusiasm to learn.

Reception this week have been focusing on pattern in maths and working out what makes a pattern, and how this can be changed into a different pattern simply by rotating an object. It has also been linked into our theme of Autumn through the use of natural materials. In the creative area they have been learning about colour mixing, to create autumnal colours to paint their leaves and then pattern with them. We have discussed why some leaves have yellow, red and brown on them while others are still green. In Literacy we have made up our own thriller counting story and are busy practicing it so it can go on dojos!

Year 3 & 4 have been working hard I'm history learning all about the Triple Trawler Tragedy by conducting research using primary and secondary sources.

In maths, they have been focusing on subtracting with year 3 using 3-digit numbers and year 4 using 4-digit numbers.

In writing, they have worked extremely hard to complete part of their independent write of the true story of the 3 little pigs, writing about the 'innocent' wolf and his unfortunate sneezing mishaps!

Within RE, they have moved onto learning all about Judaism and their places of worship and exploring life as a Jewish child.

This week we have delved even deeper into 'The Nowhere Emporium' and the revelations that Lucien Silver shared with Daniel about the shop.

In maths, we have been working on our column addition and subtraction methods. For writing, we are putting all our work on writing poems into practise by writing our own independent poems.

In afternoons, we continue to practise our drawing skills in our dragon eye art unit. It's been amazing to see how engaged the children are and we have loved seeing the pictures children have drawn at home. We have also been looking at the note B on the recorder and enjoyed playing along to a tune.

Year 6 Hive







"Working together in a safe and inclusive environment, to develop creative, disciplined and aspirational pupils." In Y6 this week, we have looked at common multiples and discussed 'Maths VIPs' to help us recognise multiples of given numbers – for example, all multiples of 5 end in a 5 or O.

In Writing, we have completed our independent pieces of writing, bringing Marty's story full circle as he reclaims his paradise! The adults in Y6 are extremely proud of the writing the children have produced and the children are in the process of 'publishing' their pieces! In reading, we have applied the skills we have learnt so far to a new short sci-fi extract, 'Dragon Pearl'.

In PE, we looked at how to use passing and dribbling to beat a defender and in Science we have started our new topic: Electricity. We have recapped our previous learning, introduced new vocabulary and introduced the scientific symbols.

This week in The Hive we have focused on the grapheme 'g', the children have practiced saying these words: 'glue', 'glasses' and 'goat'. They have done really well with these.

Our nursery rhyme of the week is 'Row, Row, Row Your Boat'. The children have ordered the song through pictures. They have traced over words from the song during mark making lessons.

In maths we have been focusing on quantities 1 to 5, the children have been matching the correct amount to the numeral through pictures and objects. Our number song of the week has been 5 speckled frogs, the children have used props to act out the song in small groups

The children were all superstars on school photo day, we hope you loved their photo.
