What's been happening in school this week?

Nursery

What a very busy and lovely week we have had. In phonics the children could hear the sound 'r' at the beginning of words. We practiced segmenting and blending words, using our segmenting fingers. In maths we have been creating ABAB patterns, using colour and shapes. There had been lots of opportunities to practice



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this independently within the classroom. We continue to learn and practice the words and actions to the rhyme 'Humpty Dumpty.' The children are listening for and identifying the rhyming words. The nursery children have been weaving this week, this has been quite tricky but the children persevered and completed the task. Have a great weekend everyone.

Reception

In phonics, the reception children have learnt four new sounds: **ai (tail), ee (sheep), ight (light) and oa (soap)**. We have been really impressed with their improved 'looking' during carpet times, so well-done reception!

In drawing club this week, we read the story 'I want my hat back'. The children loved this story and had lots of fun drawing and writing about it. The vocabulary that we taught alongside the text was: **heartbroken**, **disappointed**, **hopeless**, **wandering**, **livid**, **sneaky**, **content**. We have been using this vocabulary in the environment so it would be fantastic if you could use at home when you are chatting or playing.

The children have had lots of fun inside and out and have shown their creativity through a range of role play. They have continued to show an interest in den building and washing the bikes and scooters in the car wash. We'd love to see some den building at home so send us your pictures via Dojo if you do make one.

The adults are continuing to support children to work collaboratively by modelling the use of language such as 'Please can you pass me the...?', 'When you are finished, can I play with the...', 'I don't like it when you..., please stop.' etc. It would be great for the children to hear these phrases being used at home too, to help them put them into practice.

The children enjoyed world book day and looked absolutely wonderful, so thank you for all your efforts. The children had a special treat in assembly today when they were visited by the author of 'Hotel for Bugs', Suzy Senior.

Year 1/2

In writing this week, year 1 children have been working hard to write their own sentences all about the story 'The Squirrels Who Squabbled'. They have collected effective vocabulary to use within their own similes. Year 2 children have been collecting a range of vocabulary to describe the weather and how it could mirror our character's feelings. We have used personification within our sentences to give the weather human characteristics. We have also used a variety of drama techniques to explore how inanimate objects move within movies like Beauty and the Beast and Fantasia.

In maths, year 1 have been learning about subtraction. The Year 1 children have been using a variety of methods to complete subtraction word problems. Year 2 have continued to work on comparing length. We have also explored some word problems, mind challenges and completed our end of unit review.

In reading, year 2 have been busy completing comprehension tasks on our next extract from 'Harry the Poisonous Centipede'. This week we have been using Mana the Monitor to help us explore the text and give



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In science, we have been completing some work in our plant diaries. Last week, we planted some radishes and this week we have observed and measured their growth.

On Thursday, the children thoroughly enjoyed participating in World Book Day activities. Their costumes looked amazing, and their rocks were beautifully decorated. Thank you for all of your time and effort.

Year 3/4 What a busy week for all of our children! Some of our Year 4 children spent their first night away in Edinburgh and were absolutely amazing. Those left at school and the Yesr 3s were equally as fabulous and enjoyed getting dressed up for World Book Day.







Year 5

This week in year 5, the children have begun to develop their decimal knowledge to add and subtract to and below 1, showing some really good problem-solving skills. In writing, we have learned about a new piece of punctuation called a semi colon and have learned how to use this when writing a complex list in preparation for writing a non-chronological report. Also, in reading, we have finally discovered the tragic fate of Maisie Day and how the sisterly bond lasted the over decades. While some children enjoyed their final week of swimming, which they all succeeded brilliantly in, the rest of the year group spent time looking at world book day and completing activities linked to our top 100 reads. Finally, we started our new science module on forces and created some wonderful world book day watercolours.

Year 6

We've had another busy week in Y6 again. In Maths we have recapped short division in our arithmetic sessions. Some of the children have looked at long division and have really impressed with their resilience and self-belief. Other children have continued to look at algebra! In our Writing lessons, we have finished the first draft of our postcard/letter that we are writing from jail and are now starting to publish this! In Reading, we have continued to look at different extracts and work on our inference questions. We enjoyed talking about the message and themes of the World Book Day text – Hotel for Bugs. We also enjoyed looking at the book Skellig.

Hive

This week in phonics we have been identifying our phase 2 graphemes, our new grapheme is E. Our focus words have been elbow, egg, elephant and envelope. The children have been able to identify these focus words.

In maths we have explored shapes and repeating patterns. The children enjoyed using paint and blocks to make their own large-scale repeating pattern.

We have been getting creative by making cards with handprints and felt tips, the children also wrote inside the cards tracing over their names. In cookery we have made buns and decorated them with icing.

It was lovely to see all the world book day costumes.
