What's been happening in school this week?

Nursery

The children have listened carefully in phonics, hearing the phoneme 'b' at the beginning of words. Ask your child what words they know beginning with this sound. In literacy the children performed the rhyme 'Incy Wincy' spider to their peers, using actions with each verse. We have seen lots of children engaging in mark making this week, the adults have encouraged some children to think about the colours they use and adding more detail and features to their work to extend their ideas. In maths we have talked about measure, using lots of maths language such as long, short, tall, longer, shorter and height. We used bricks to compare length and height. We have enjoyed making Easter crafts and the children are looking forward to their Easter Bonnet parade. Enjoy your Easter break.

Reception

Reception have had an extremely busy week in phonics learning new tricky words and phonemes. We have used our knowledge to help write words and sentences. In drawing club, we have looked at wacky races and had lots of fun designing cars and exploring new vocabulary. In maths we have been exploring number bonds to 3, 4, 5 and 6. We have looked at different ways of making these using various resources and recorded them on a part whole model. We even tried writing some number sentences that wowed us. We have enjoyed learning about the celebration of Easter and making some beautiful Easter cards which the children can't wait to bring home to show you. We loved showing off our amazing Easter bonnets on our parade around the school. What a fantastic week we have had!

Year 1/2

In writing this week the Year 1 children have enjoyed exploring and carefully choosing similes to describe the crafty bird who stole the last pinecone from the squirrels. The children have thought carefully about the choices they are making to ensure they create the desired effect. The Year 1 children have worked incredibly hard this week in using all their learning from this unit of writing and have completed their independent write, a recount of events based on the story 'The Squirrels Who Squabbled'. Year 2 have also been working very hard on planning and writing their independent narrative based on the story 'The Building Boy'. They have enjoyed making careful selections of new vocabulary, applying all of the skills and important features learnt within the unit to their writing.


In maths Year 1 have continued to explore measure. They have applied their understanding of comparing measure to word problems and real-life examples. Year 2 have continued their learning of mass, they have been focussing on comparing the mass of three objects, and finding the difference of the mass of different objects. In science the children have completed their diary of a radish plant. The children have explored and understand



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everything a plant needs to be healthy. They have written an equipment list and instructions for planting a radish; completed weekly observational findings on the growth of their plant and have also compared this to a plant without water and a plant without sunlight. The children have demonstrated a fantastic understanding and ability to take care of and grow a healthy plant.

In Design and Technology, the children have really enjoyed applying their skills of a running stitch and a cross stitch to begin their final piece of making a purse. The children are able to name and identify the equipment they will need to complete this project and can explain the process of completing the stitch they are going to use.

All of the children have worked exceptionally hard over the spring term – we hope you all have a much-deserved rest and enjoy the Easter break.

Year 3/4

Another busy week! Miss Townsend's class have been working extremely hard in their swimming lessons and all children have made excellent progress! We are so proud of them! All of the children in year 3 and 4 have been writing and editing their instructions this week on "How to be respectful" and have then taken great care when publishing them. Some fabulous ideas and a lot of resilience has been shown by all children. Our sewing morning was a great success and the children were thrilled to take home their projects or the project a friend had made for them. It was nice to have so many of you in to help us! Year 5

Busy last week in Year 5. In writing we have been focussing on using semi colons in a complex list when writing our non-chronological reports on the Emperor Penguins. In maths we have finished our fractions, decimals and percentages unit.

In the afternoon we have explored Easter story in Christianity and what the crucifixion means to Christians. In Geography we have been inspired by our London trip and created our own tube map for Hull and the East Riding. We wish you all a restful Easter and we look forward to seeing the children when we return for the summer term.

Year 6

We have continued our SATs preparations in Y6 this week by looking at subtracting fractions with different denominators, including calculations with wholes. We have continued to practise our Reading skills on a range of texts and have looked at VGP questions around the use of capital letters, full stops, clauses and modal verbs. We have enjoyed learning about sign language as part of British Sign Language Week and enjoyed our final archery lesson!

Hive

This week in the hive we have been exploring different emotions by looking at our reflections in the mirror and practicing our happy and sad faces. The children have joined in with the actions to the song if you are happy and you know it.
